PHS Growth Plan/Strategic Plan - Rae-dene

- Core competencies for our school are: 1. Thinking 2. Personal and Social/Self regulation
- Growth plan can be viewed on the district website.
- The students and staff were asked for their input and what changes they would like to see happen at the school.

Shifts for 2025-2026

- TA shifting to morning only as a check-in to increase class time. Students support less TA and more class time. Sticking with multigrade TA as students supported this.
- Computers to be based in classrooms (Hattie research).
- There will be a 10 minute break between 2nd and 3rd class to facilitate nutrition and stretch break. This is grounded in research and students supported this.
- X block only once per week to allow for more contact time in academic classes and more flexibility in scheduling. It will also allow for PE more often for junior classes.
- Changing how junior students get electives. They will have academic classes in the morning and electives in the afternoon to support more focus in the morning time.
- Reading time will remain as this supports the need for more literacy skills. 25 minutes per week of reading equals almost 17 hours of reading a year.
