1. Welcome and Call to Order

Meeting called to order at 5:30 PM by Anne.

2. Approval of Agenda

5. Community School Report - Cheyenne

- Additional notes: The PH Community School can subsidize lifeguard courses. They are looking for a new person to organize hot breakfast (2 hours of work per breakfast).

6. DPAC Report – Rachael

- Rachael is stepping down as DPAC Chair and as DPAC representative of the PHSS board.
- We need a new DPAC representative on our board.

7. School Trustee Report - Tracey McLelland

- Trustee report presented.
- We were happy to welcome our Thirteenth Student trustee Poppy Mackenzie Arnet at our 1st Board meeting of the school year. Poppy is only the 2nd Student trustee from the Pender Harbour Area. The student Trustee is elected each year into the position by their peers at the District Student Leadership Team and their role is to represent student voice and perspective at the board table.
- Trustees were presented with financial statements at our last board meeting. These were
 discussed and approved. Copies of the financial statements are available on the district
 website
- There was a residential School Survivor's honorary Graduation Ceremony held on September 17th. This ceremony has been in the works for almost 5 years and was a collaboration between the shíshálh Nation, Syiyaya movement and School District 46. It was an incredibly moving experience, and I was fortunate to be a part of it. More

- The School District is currently going through a public consultation process for the potential disposal of School District owned land on Hough Road in Gibsons. This land is considered surplus, and has not been used for educational purposes. The purpose of a potential sale is to help to fund the purchase of a bus yard and facility as we currently rent space by way of our bussing contract. The eventual electrification of the bus fleet will be required to support the new electric buses we have received through grants, and the infrastructure will require significant investment. The Long Range Facilities plan which was most recently updated in 2023 identifies this as a focus area for facilities. The government does not fund land for bussing as it is not part of services that districts are required to provide. There is further information about the property and disposal process on the school district website including the Long Range Facilities Plan and we are looking for public input on the disposal to be sent to questions@sd46.bc.ca
- Families YMCA run childcare centres in Gibsons and West Sechelt were given notice that as of Oct 1st the centres will not be functioning due to staffing shortages. These centres run out of SD46 property. Though these centres operate out of district property, we do not have a role in providing childcare in these centres, other than as landlords. However, as a district we are strong advocates for sustainable, affordable childcare. There have been meetings with YMCA staff, SD46 staff, representatives from the province, and affective families to try to find short term and long-term solutions. Board Chair Amaral is scheduled for another meeting with families this week to continue to assist in advocacy efforts.

8. Business Updates

• Hot Lunch (Debbie):.

- We discussed options for ways to run the hot lunch program. Topics included using software, charging for hot lunch, suggested donations through e-transfers (\$5 per meal) and having free hot lunch for the entire school.
- We have a handful of volunteers for the first lunch on Oct 1st. We need more volunteers to be able to run the program on a one lunch a week basis.
- We discussed wanting to have funds to support students in other causes such as field trips and sports in addition to hot lunch.
- We are expecting donations from the Rotary and the Legion for the hot lunch program.

- The Anglican Church has reached out to us inquiring about the hot lunch program. Ann will be in contact with them.
- A hot lunch committee was created. Members of the committee are Debbie Martens, Stephanie Van Dyk, Virginia Bowen, Zoey Mackenzie, Janna Vallee, Cheryl Alsop, Shelby Leech and Kyle Leech.
- Motion to commit \$1000 to support the next 4 hot lunches by Jodee, seconded by Tanis. Motion Carried.

• Fundraising (Debbie):

- Fundraisers discussed include golf and burger night as Ace's, poker night in Nov with the Lions Club (Kyle), tea towel sales, coffee sales, hot chocolate stand at winter fest, Christmas card sales, and fire wood/kindling sales (Dave McKay). Cheryl has a cotton candy machine that is available for our use.
- Some PHSS students are brainstorming ways for a student fundraiser specifically for hot lunch because they love it so much.

9. New Business

- Cell Phone Policy: Discussed cell phone policy at school and on the bus.
 - Kids have locks on their lockers in order to have a secure place to store their phones during class time. PHSS has clear expectations for students to take care of their personal belongings and store belongings securely in their locker.
 - Cell phone use is not permitted in class and between classes. Phones may be used before and after school, during breaks and at lunch. If a student violates the school policy too many times, their phone goes to the office.
 - Parents are asked not to text their student during school hours. Parents can call the school to communicate messages to their student. Students may also call home from the office.
 - There is a provincial cell phone policy with each district and school to manage their own.
 - In general, it is illegal to have phones in washrooms and change rooms. There are signs throughout the school (including bathrooms) and in classrooms on what is expected in terms of student behaviour and cell phone use.
 - The bussing company is separate from the school district and may have different rules regarding cell phone use. Patrick to follow up. A SD46 Code of Conduct while on the bus can be found here: https://sd46.bc.ca/wp-content/uploads/4160-Transportation-of-

10. Principal's Report – Patrick Kinghorn

- Report presented and discussed.
- Patrick introduced himself and provided a brief personal and professional background.
- PHSS Students (76) in total: Grade 12(14), Grade 11(8), Grade 10 (13), Grade 9 (8), Grade 8 (19), Grade 7 (14).
- The district is updating the code of conduct. Patrick would like to update the PHSS code of conduct with parents. Meeting with parents to be announced.
- 1701 Data Submission is happening this week: This is how schools get their funding. For grades 10, 11, 12 funding is per course. For grades 7, 8, 9 funding is per student. Data needs to be completed and submitted this week. Principal Pednaud left PHSS with a good budget to start the year.
- Staffing: A .60 hire is needed for STEM 7/9 (Science Focus). Mr. Belissomo is picking up .40 (Math Focus). IXL is being used to keep up with numeracy. They can use it at home.
- Senior girls volleyball has begun and we are trying to get games with other schools. Tuesday intramural volleyball has also begun.
