Hot lunch Update (submitted by Debbie)

First of all, I just wanna say thank you very much to the Hot Lunch committee for all your efforts so far. Having a team behind hot lunch will make things far easier this year.

Also, I wanted to let everybody know that Stephanie Van Dyke has graciously agreed to be our fearless Hot Lunch leader. I will be her assistant, her and I will work together, so thank you Stephanie for taking over as lead Hot Lunch person.

Patrick reached out and the whole school is going to the aquarium on Nov 12, which is a hot lunch day. He was curious if we could possibly figure out away we can feed the kids that day. Any thoughts?

Just in case you didn't see it on the PHSS PAC page:

St Hilda's Angelican Church in Sechelt has donated \$1200 to cover November's Hot Lunch Program at PHSS. This is amazing, and we are so grateful to Janet McIntosh for mentioning our program to them.

We also received money from the Pender Harbour Rotary 50/50 sales \$425, the PACs contribution \$1,000 for the first 4 hot lunches and with the \$1,200 from the Angelican Church, we should be able to make it to the end of December and keep the lunches free. Whoop Whoop!

Each Hot Lunch cost us around \$300, Give or take! So Oct 29-Dec 17th is 8 hot lunches and will cost up to \$2,400.

So far we have had:

- 1. Caesar salad wraps, with or without chicken.
- 2. Lasagna
- 3. Pizza

This week is Broccoli Alfredo with or with out chicken. As with each hot lunch we try our best to accommodate all dietary needs, which includes vegan, vegetarian and gluten free options.

We saved money on 3 out of 4 of our hot lunches, as we already had some stuff on hand and we got a few good sale. So we were able to treat the kids to pizza. We tried Dominos for most of our pizzas. We got our gluten free option from pizza hut and our vegan pizza came from fresh slice. The kids were thrilled!

We snuck in just under \$1,000 for the first 4 hot lunches, we saved money as we had already purchased chicken strips from the spring chicken sale, we got some great deals on other hot lunch items and we had a few donations. So this helped keep our costs just under \$1,000. We put out a volunteer request, as each week we need a cook and a helper. Here is what's left,

We are continuing our fundraising efforts so we can continue to serve hot lunch free from Jan - June 2027

We would like to ask the community school if we can use some of their space in the harbour spiel so we can put a small poster letting everyone in the community know we want to keep hot lunch fee and are looking for donations, Cheyenne would that be ok?

Strait Coffee - End of Nov- beginning of Dec and again March or April

Student Art Xmas Calendars, Xmas cards and maybe tea towels. Selling at Dec Xmas fair and at WinterFest possibly.

Winterfest: Dec 20 3-7pm

Last year we made hot chocolate with all the toppings like whipped cream and sprinkles and

apple cider. We also sold the rest of our tea towels that we had for sale. So we would sell any left over Xmas cards/calendars and tea towels if we do them. Last year Iga donated hot chocolate, sprinkles, whipped cream. We got the hot apple cider down coast at Clayton's. Starbucks donated coffee and cups. We need to decide if we want to take this on and if so, we need a lead person. I'm unfortunately working that day, so I can't help. It takes 3 of us to run this smoothly. So we need to Vote to see if we want to take this one on and we need a volunteer to be the ring leader.

Bottle Drive:

We'd love to do a bottle drive beginning of January. A few people asked if we wanted to do a bottle drive, typically the grads do a bottle drive but if they were only planning on hosting one, the hot lunch committee thought we could host one as well, there seems to be plenty of bottles/cans that people would like to donate. Waiting to hear back to see if we can do a bottle Drive as well.

<u>Fire wood sale</u>- if we want to do this, we would need a few people to take it on.

Live Auction at the Legion: Feb-March?

Same as a silent auction, but we would do the auction live, have live music or so a talent show (
this could include teachers and students) and drinks and maybe food included or they can just
