Treasurer's Report by Jodee Young

Highlights:

- Profit from Chicken sales was \$1584.73
- The regular account currently has \$5018.31
- The gaming grant currently has \$175.14. A PAC donation to the yearbook usually comes out of the gaming account, but we could also give some from the regular bank account. Julie still needs to be reimbursed for hot lunch costs. Julie thinks that would be around \$500. She's been reducing costs by buying certain things at Costco, and also using the surplus on the IGA account. The IGA account now only has about \$100 left.
- Julie has spoken to the Grasshopper about starting a 'Chase the Ace' to benefit the PAC, and they were interested. We should look into whether a different type of gaming license is required for this type of fundraising. Julie volunteered to work on the 'Chase the Ace' idea, and Tanis offered to help as well. It would be an ongoing fundraiser.
